Excerpts from Christopher Columbus' Logbook, 1492 A.D.

October 11th

They were very friendly to us. I presented gave them some red caps and many other things of small <u>value</u>¹. They <u>were much delighted</u>² and became wonderfully <u>attached</u> <u>to</u>³ us I think these people would be good servants. I also think that they would very easily become Christians, as they seemto have no religion.

October 14th

I have ordered to take seven of them to Spain in order to learn our language. If <u>your Highnesses</u>⁴ should choose transport all of them to Spain it would be no problem, I could conquer⁵ all of them with fifty men and govern⁶ them as I pleased.

November 12th

They learn very quickly the prayers we <u>repeat</u>⁷ to them, and they also learn to make the cross. Your Highnesses should therefore <u>convert them</u>⁸ to Christianity. I think a very short time would be enough for Spain to gain great riches and immense dominions⁹ with all their inhabitants.
